- \* **Fourth Grade Recognition** – This Friday’s special program will recognize all of our fourth grade students who will be moving on to the Middle School **at 8:15 a.m.** in the gymnasium. Guests of fourth grade students are invited to a reception in the Buttery following this program. Dismissal for summer vacation will be at 11:00. Lunch will not be served unless your child is enrolled in Extended Day.
- \* **Parking This Friday** - Parking will be available at several different locations Friday morning. Second Street Christian Church, the Upper School Parking lot, Central Christian Church (entering off of Corral Street and using those spaces closest to Corral), & Carrick House. In addition, you can also find parking in the reserved red bagged parking spots along Limestone in front of our Front Circle, in our Front Circle after 8:10 a.m., in our visitor spaces behind the Lower School, or any on the street parking that is available.
- \* **Extended Day - On May 24**, Extended Day will open at 11:00 a.m. to accommodate 11:00 dismissal. Students who are signed up will go to Extended Day. Pizza lunch will be served to all Extended Day participants. The program closes at its regular 5:45 time. It is imperative that your child be registered in the Extended Day building if he/she will attend on May 24. Extended Day will be closed May 27<sup>th</sup> through May 31<sup>st</sup>, with Summer Safari starting on June 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- \* **School Year Ends** - The last day of school for all students will be this **Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup>**. Students in preschool through 4<sup>th</sup> grade will dismiss at 11:00 a.m.
