Allison has won numerous awards regionally and locally.

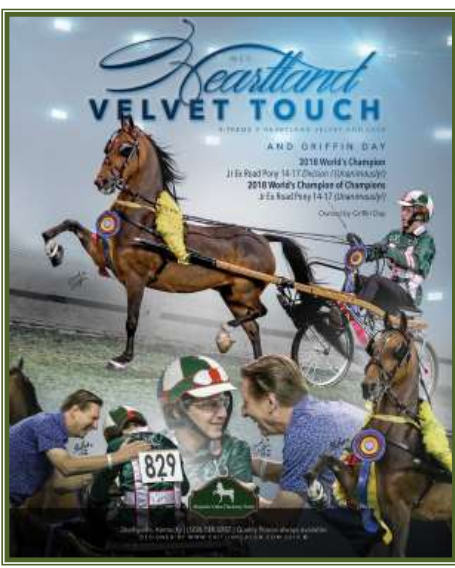
